HISTORY AND ACHIEVEMENTS OF ANTALYA ANADOLU İMAM HATİP HIGH SCHOOL



Establishment and Early Years

Antalya Anadolu İmam Hatip High School is one of the first eight İmam Hatip High Schools opened in Turkey, making it historically significant. The school started education in 1953 with 101 students in its building at Kale Kapısı. In the 1956-1957 academic year, it graduated its first 37 students from the 4-year middle school section.

Relocation and Growth

In the 1967-1968 academic year, the school moved to its current address. In the 1993-1994 academic year, an Anadolu İmam Hatip High School section was added to the school.

The February 28 Process and Afterwards

After the February 28 process, the number of students dropped to around seventy. However, with the resolution of the coefficient problem, the school reached its former student numbers. With the increase in the number of İmam Hatip High Schools in the country and the city, the school planned to reduce its student number to 700. It was turned into a "Science and Social Sciences Project School" that admits students through a central exam, by the decision of the General Directorate of Religious Education.

Academic Achievements

Antalya Anadolu İmam Hatip High School places students in various university departments such as Medicine, Engineering, Architecture, Education, Theology, and Social Sciences every year. In recent years, the school has also stood out with national rankings.

This historic school continues its educational activities successfully and is the first school that comes to mind regarding İmam Hatip education in Antalya.

With the motto "Pioneering in Knowledge, Pioneering in Morality," our school aims to be a distinguished institution that is open to development and change, upholds national and spiritual values, and nurtures individuals who guide humanity in the light of the Qur'an and the Sunnah.

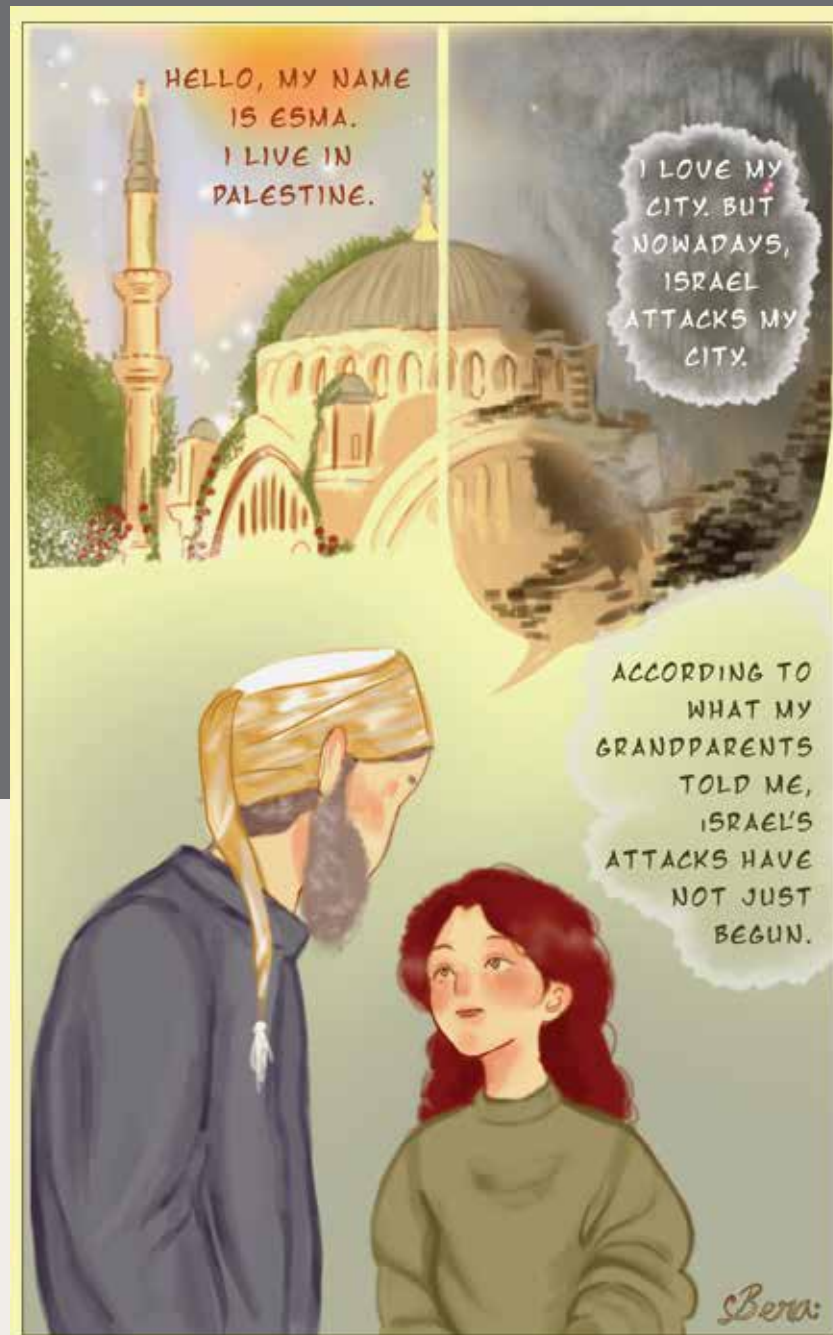

During the attacks yesterday a bomb dropped in the garden of our house. My brother Yusuf was playing in the garden at that time and he was very scared.

I miss the days when we could play games in peace with my brother. I hope that attacks will end as soon as possible.

OUR E-TWINNING AND ERASMUS PLUS PROJECTS HISTORY



WHAT IS e-TWINNING?

e-Twinning, an initiative funded by European Union, serves as an online platform facilitating school partnerships across Europe. It offers a wide range of tools and resources for educators to collaborate on joint projects with schools in other countries. Through the platform teachers can search for partner schools based on shared interests or themes, communicate securely with their partners and excess a variety of educational materials and tools to support their collaboration. Projects include diverse subjects, including stem, language, learning arts, social studies, climate studies, etc.

These projects encourage students to develop 21st century skills such as communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and digital literacy while fostering into cultural understanding and tolerance.

Additionally, e-Twinning provides opportunities for professional development by the way of training courses, conferences, and online seminars; enabling educators to enhance their international networks.Overall, e-Twinning plays a crucial role in promoting international cooperation and enriching educational experiences for both students and teachers.

Our school is an official e-Twinning school since 2020. Some of our projects are: Come See Learn, Al-Khwarizmi Education Model,Save Environment with 3R, 81 cities and a life that is 81 days long.

In this 4 years of journey our school accomplished projects succesfully. Because of our schools' teachers' and students' active participation and efficient work on e-Twinning projects we were entitled to receive the European Quality Label which is a certificate that is given to the ones with the highest ranking among those which received the National Quality Label. The European Quality Label is actually an indication that the projects that were run reached a certain European standard



ERASMUS PLUS AND OUR EXPERIENCE WITH IT

Our school has been involved in Erasmus Plus Programme with two different projects throughout the years. The former project that was run by our school "Be Friendly To Nature" which was a School Partnership Project. This project was proceeded by 5 countries including Croatia, Spain, Portugal, Italy and Türkiye.

Some of the topics of the project were:

Climate change, environmental issues, recycling, sustainability, intercultural interaction, social changes, European sustainability goals and social advancement of disadvantaged students.

The first mobility of the project was realized in the city of Torrevieja, Spain and the students tried to find solutions to environmental issues while examining different species of animals in their natural habitat. **The second mobility** of the project took place in the city Labin, Croatia. They observed the flora and fauna of the city and they spend a very efficient week there.

The third mobility was to Italy, Palermo. They practiced and examined studies in order to protect sea turtles. **The fourth mobility** took place in Türkiye, Adiyaman. With the study named "Water is Life" they emphasized the importance of water in our life. **The fifth mobility** of the project was held in the city of Viella, Portugal and they exhibited the artworks made by using the benefits of recycling. **The sixth and the last mobility** was also realized in Türkiye furthermore our school was the host of this grand finale, the countries collaborated in order to find ways to find sustainable farming systems.



Youth exchanges are also the part of Erasmus+ program that offers young people the opportunity to participate in international youth exchanges. These exchanges typically involve groups of young people from different countries coming together to participate in various activities such as workshops, discussions, outdoor activities, cultural events, and community projects. The aim is to promote intercultural learning, active citizenship and personal development among participants. Erasmus youth exchanges provide unique opportunities for young people whom interested in exploring new cultures developing new skills making new friends and contributing to the world through their actions.

Our school has participated in an **Erasmus+ youth exchange project** named "One Step Ahead" in Poland, Zakopane with a group of 9 students and an English teacher as the group leader. We met with our peers from Italy, Serbia and Poland. The project was about democracy and aimed to inform students about discrimination, equality and encourage them to be active citizens in our countries.

ALPEREN ŞENGÜN

Alperen Şengün is a Turkish professional basketball player. He plays in the center and long forward positions. He plays for the NBA team Houston Rockets.

Şengün, who started playing basketball in his hometown Giresun, signed his first professional contract in Bandırma. He spent the 2018-19 season in the Turkish Basketball League team Bandırma Kırmızı and was promoted to the first team in the 2019-20 season. In 2020, he signed with the Basketball Super League team Beşiktaş. He became the MVP of the Basketball Super League in the 2020-21 season with Beşiktaş. He also became the youngest basketball player to become MVP in the league. He was selected by the Oklahoma City Thunder in the 1st round, 16th overall, in the 2021 NBA Draft and was traded to the Houston Rockets.

NBA RECORDS

With his performance in the NBA, Şengün broke many records. He became the youngest center to reach 1000 points and 200 assists in the NBA and the youngest basketball player to score at least 30 points, 10 rebounds and 5 assists in an NBA game. He became the youngest center in NBA history to achieve a triple-double and the youngest basketball player in Houston Rockets history to achieve this. At the age of 21 years and 99 days, Şengün became the youngest center in NBA history to reach 500 assists, surpassing Nikola Jokić's record at the age of 22 years and 40 days.

STEPHEN CURRY

Wardell Stephen Curry II ; born March 14, 1988) [1] is an American professional basketball player for the Golden State Warriors of the National Basketball Association (NBA). Widely regarded as the greatest shooter and one of the greatest players of all time, Curry is credited with revolutionizing the sport by inspiring teams and players to take more three-point shots.[2][3][4][5] He is a four-time NBA champion, a two-time NBA Most Valuable Player (MVP), an NBA Finals MVP, an NBA All-Star Game MVP, and was named the inaugural NBA Western Conference Finals MVP. He is also a ten-time NBA All-Star, a nine-time All-NBA selection (including four on the First Team), and has won two gold medals at the FIBA World Cup as a member of the U.S. men's national team.



Curry is the holder of numerous other records, notably for his efficiency and three-point shooting. He has the highest career free-throw percentage in NBA history (91.0%) and has led the league in three-pointers made a record seven times. In 2013, he set the NBA record for three-pointers made in a regular season with 272, surpassed that record in 2015 (286), and again in 2016 (402).

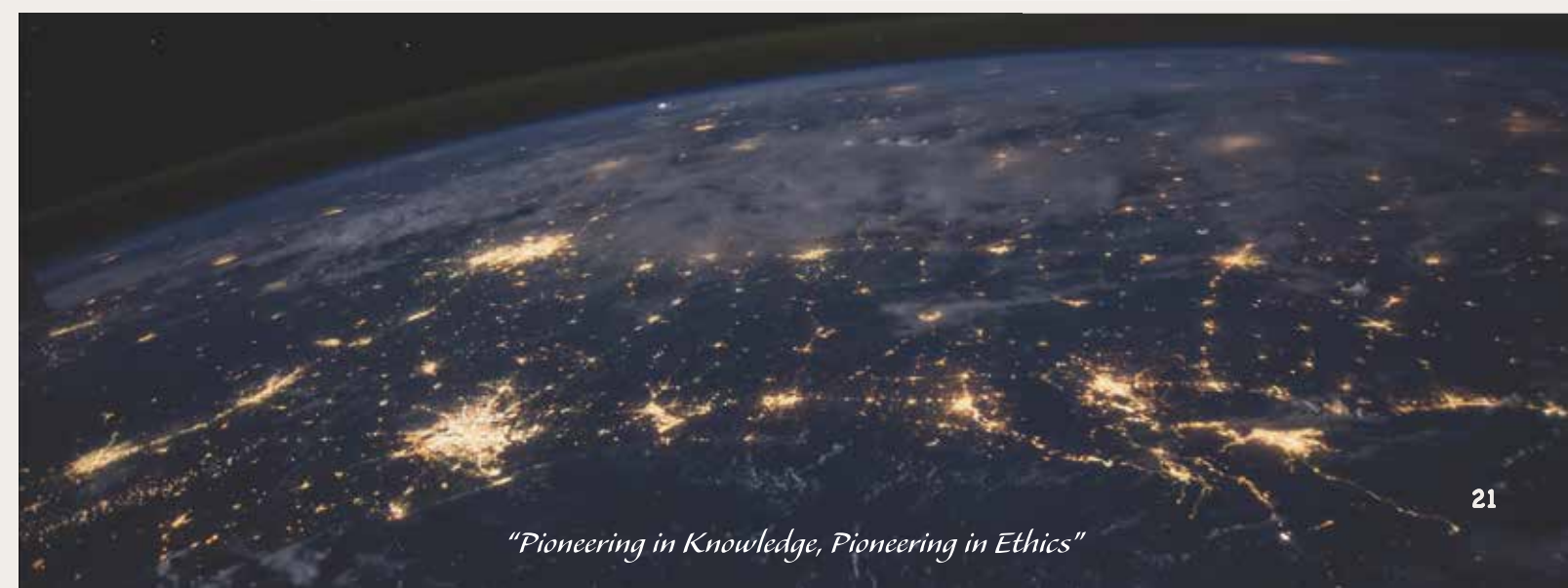

These events are usually for high school and college students, but sometimes middle school students can join too. You don't have to be an expert to take part; anyone in those age groups who wants to learn about world problems and try out diplomacy can join or organize an MUN conference.

OUR INVOLVEMENT

Our school started participating in Model United Nations (MUN) activities last year. Initially, we gained experience by participating in training sessions and MUNs within Antalya first in very small groups. This year, we began participating as a delegation in national-level conferences, starting with GITOMUN'23 held in Istanbul.

During this period, we capitalized on the unique opportunities provided by MUNs and gained in-depth experiences in international relations, global issues, and diplomacy. In MUN conferences, we had the opportunity to simulate real-life diplomatic processes by representing different countries or organizations. These experiences helped us enhance our analytical thinking skills, improve our research and critical writing abilities, and acquire profound knowledge about complex global issues.

Additionally, participating in MUNs enabled us to enhance our public speaking skills, empathy, leadership, collaboration, and problem-solving abilities.

These MUN experiences have not only laid a significant foundation for our future careers but also helped us become more conscious and effective global citizens.

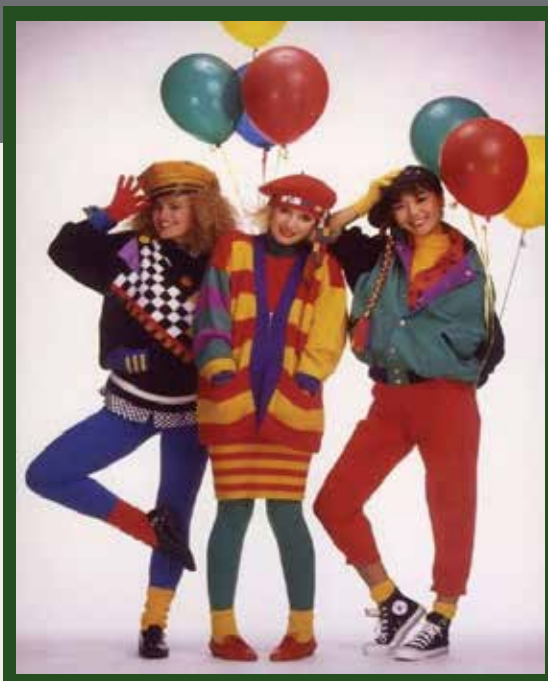
FASHION IN 80' S
